TERMINOLOGY

RHO UPSILON

Name of our chapter here at Pepperdine University.

BID

An invitation given to a prospective member inviting them to join the Fraternity via the pledge education process.

PLEDGING CEREMONY

The required formal ceremony preceding the pledge process where invited students or faculty are presented with a pledge pin.

PLEDGE

A business/economics student or faculty who pledged to Delta Sigma Pi during a Pledging Ceremony, but is not yet an initiated member.

PLEDGE CLASS

Each group of recruits chosen to be a potential brother of the Rho Upsilon chapter will go through the pledge process together. The Spring 2024 recruits will be the Alpha Gamma pledge class.

BIG + LITTLE

Each pledge will be paired with a mentor of their choice. This mentor is your Big and you are their Little.

INITIATION

The final ceremony where a pledge becomes an official Brother of the fraternity.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS RECRUITMENT?

The process used by Delta Sigma Pi to promote membership and invite business and economics students to scheduled meetings and activities so they may be considered for an invitation to membership.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO JOIN?

1. Must be a student in the Business/Communications division at Pepperdine's Seaver College, or pursuing an MBA/JD/MPP at Pepperdine's Graziadio Business School.
2. Must have at least 1 semester remaining after initiation (not including current semester).
3. Must be of good moral character and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.7.
4. Must not be a member of any conflicting national organizations, including Alpha Kappa Psi, Phi Gamma Nu and Phi Chi Theta.

ARE ALL OF THE RECRUITMENT EVENTS MANDATORY?

We understand and encourage students to be involved with other commitments on campus; however, it is highly encouraged for potential new members to attend all recruitment events. Although they are not mandatory, recruitment events provide students with the opportunity to meet active brothers and leave a lasting impression. Please note that the last recruitment event (interviews) is invite-only.

HOW OFTEN DOES YOUR CHAPTER RECRUIT? IS THERE A LIMIT TO HOW MANY PLEDGES YOU ACCEPT?

We recruit both Fall and Spring semesters during the first month of school. We do not have a fixed number of candidates that we take each semester. Decisions are made on an individual basis and bids are extended to those who we believe to be a good fit for our fraternity.

IF I DON'T RECEIVE A BID, CAN I PARTICIPATE IN RECRUITMENT AGAIN NEXT SEMESTER?

Absolutely, and we encourage it! You may be considered for a bid up to three times. We have brothers who were not offered a bid during their first recruitment. Sometimes, individuals learn from the process and are able to better prepare for the next round of recruitment.

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT?

The time commitment for the pledge process can be compared to taking a 4 unit course. Once you are initiated as a brother, you will attend weekly chapter meetings, and participate in chapter events. However, you'll get out of this experience whatever amount of time you decide to put in.

TIPS FOR RECRUITMENT

Network with Brothers

Connect with brothers you may not have met before. Take advantage of your time and have meaningful conversations with brothers about your professional goals, aspirations, plans after college, etc. These conversations will leave lasting impressions that give us a better understanding of who you are as a candidate.

Plan Professionally

It's never bad to over-prepare, especially in the business world. Potential Brothers have seen success when reviewing our [website](#), reviewing our core values, and learning some brother's [names](#). While it is not a requirement to do this, potential brothers may use these topics for conversation starters during recruitment.

Develop a Resume

Delta Sigma Pi's recruitment process includes a resume workshop and review. So, whether you currently have a resume you are proud of or you have not yet written one, come to recruitment with printed copies of your resume for review. There will be opportunities for all potential members to meet with resume reviewers, who will help potential members enhance their document.

Persistence

Potential New Members who do not receive a bid but are still interested in Delta Sigma Pi are heavily encouraged to attend our recruitment during the following semester! Students may attend up to three semesters, so be persistent and demonstrate your individuality to the best of your ability!

Maximize Recruitment

Recruitment is going to have a lasting effect on all attendees, whether they receive a bid or not. Whether you receive advice for your resume or learn how to tell your story during an interview setting, recruitment allows students to better themselves professionally and build professional skills that will last them past their four years at Seaver College.
